Permanent Deacon Program

Once every four years, the Catholic Diocese of Saginaw accepts applications for the Permanent Diaconate. The diocese will hold an informational session for all interested men — and their wives if married — from 7 to 9 p.m. on Tuesday, Oct. 11 at the diocesan Center for Ministry, 5802 Weiss St., Saginaw. Applications for admission into the program will be available at this session.

Applicants should have completed at least two years of lay ministry formation by May of 2017 (or a degree in theology or equivalent). They are also required to have the support of their pastor or pastoral administrator..
