Marriage: Contact parish office no less than six months prior to wedding date.


Sacrament of Anointing of Sick: Please contact us before a surgery, during hospitalization or if experiencing a change in health.

If you work with children in our parishes in any capacity, you are required to attend an informative VIRTUS session and complete the required paperwork (for a background check and acknowledgement that you have received the diocesan policies). A VIRTUS session is scheduled at our St. Vincent de Paul site on Wednesday, Aug. 31, 6:00-9:00pm. Call the parish office to register. (Note to parents: The August 31 session will outline how a predator can move from "stranger" to acceptable acquaintance. It's very informative and may help you with discussions with your kids. The paperwork is only required if you wish to work with children in the parish.)

Have You Been Vacationing?

You may have missed some of the information below:

First United Methodist Church has joined our Food Pantry efforts with a clothing ministry. Several times a month they bring clean, sorted clothing for visitors to our Pantry. Take clothing donations to Church of the Nazarene (corner of Lincoln and Pickard Rds., Mt. Pleasant). There is a small drop off structure open 24 hours a day for donations. Members there clean and sort all clothing. The Methodist volunteers pick up clothing there and bring it here.

Collection for the Diocese for Military Services Envelopes are still in our entries. You may still support our service families with a donation to their faith needs in this collection taken up every three years. This year our parish has donated \$75.

Collection for Saginaw Diocese Priest Retirement Our diocese bills our parish \$21.40 per envelope holder annually for our priests' retirement. That's \$6,634 per year to support those who have served us faithfully. Our diocese suggests that parishioners also may wish to give personally. This year our parish has received \$50 in additional donations for retirement. Information brochures are in the main entry.
