
Sacrament of Anointing of Sick: Please contact us before a surgery, during hospitalization or if experiencing a change in health.

From Faith Formation Director Mary Moomey

As Director of Faith Formation I often tell families that the best way to nurture their children's faith is to live their faith. Along with living their faith it is important to say your faith. Sometimes people don't think they are qualified to speak about faith. They think that is for priests or religious or catechists. But children are concrete thinkers. It is not always obvious to them the connection between faith and everyday life. Most parents try their best to live their faith and a quiet sentence spoken in the midst of an ordinary day can help children see that connection. Such as: We don't make fun of others because Jesus wants us to show love; or We go to Mass to show God we love him and to receive his love; or I know you are upset but the Holy Spirit is with us and will help us. Most of the time there is no long discussion and life continues on with the reminder of this truth.

Saying we need to do something or not do something because the church tells us to does not take us far enough to the heart of the faith. The heart of the faith is that God loves us and wants us to love him and follow him out of love. Children and young people can grasp that long before they understand other theology. Of course as adults we know that it is not always easy to follow Jesus but we have the sacraments, the Bible, the church teachings, prayer, worship and the whole Body of Christ (the church) to help us. The more we share what we believe with our children the more they will learn to live their faith.
