Brothers and Sisters.

Like all of you, I was broken-hearted at the release of the Pennsylvania grand jury report last week. Thinking of all the hurt, pain and the sense of betrayal can leave one numb. We can be caught in a place where we wonder, where do we go from here.

Pope Francis wrote to the People of God and the entire document is worth reading, but one section stood out to me. Bishop Cistone quoted this same section.

"The heart-wrenching pain of these victims, which cries out to heaven, was long ignored, kept quiet or silenced. But their outcry was more powerful than all the measures meant to silence it, or sought even to resolve it by decisions that increased its gravity by falling into complicity. The Lord heard that cry and once again showed us on which side he stands."

Progress is made through the collaboration of all the faithful. It is incumbent on all of us to look after one another, to protect everyone, but especially those who are most vulnerable from all forms of abuse. The Virtus program helps parish and diocesan employees and volunteers who work with young people identify concerns and establish best practices and work for the protection of young people. Virtus training is a requirement for all those mentioned above.

Thursday August 23 at 7pm, we will have an evening of prayer for healing and hope. All are welcome.


