TWENTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today I want to take a moment to address a question that may pop into your head in the future. "Where did the candles next to the tabernacle go?" The two candle stands will be taken from the sides of the tabernacle, in part to allow the red light signifying the presence of the Eucharist to be closer to it.

Paragraph 79 of the USCCB document "Built of Living Stones: Art, Architecture and Worship" states "Careful planning is needed so that the placement (of the tabernacle) chosen does not draw attention of the faithful away from the eucharistic celebration and its components. In addition, the placement must allow for a focus on the tabernacle for those periods of quiet prayer outside the celebration of the Eucharist."

In the next paragraph it states about tabernacles directly behind the altar "...consideration should be given to using distance, lighting or some other architectural device that separates the tabernacle and reservation area during Mass...". The distance and the architectural details at present do that. But placing two candles around it, just like at the altar during Mass, draw both together when our focus should be the altar and ambo.

While meeting with some folks last week to discuss liturgical decoration, it was brought up how important it is to communicate and educate why things occur. I will try to explain why a substantive change is made before they occur.

Would you like to be a Communion Minister?


