

Dear Friends in Christ,

This week's letter has been a challenge to write. Sitting in two piles on my desk are information for Vocations Awareness week, and Bishop Hurley's letter regarding the clergy sexual abuse crisis which is an insert in this bulletin. The letter is important, and the US Bishops three-fold intentions for healing and support of victims, conversion and just punishment, and for strength are hopeful.

One might initially think that we can't or shouldn't pray for vocations at a time like this. We might think that, who would consider priesthood or religious life in this environment? First and foremost, God does. It is important to realize, that holy orders and religious life are a result of our response to God's call deep in our heart.

The first prayer for vocations I learned was years ago at a Knights of Columbus meeting. Two parts stand out to me still this day. The first "touch with Grace the hearts of many young men and women, moving them to offer themselves as candidates for the priesthood and religious life" is a reminder that God calls, we respond. The second "Inspire fathers and mothers and all members of Christian families to become aware of the great need for religious vocations." is a reminder that the call to vocation often begins in the home.

All of us are called to some form of vocation. We need to recognize that our unique gifts are placed before us to build up the Kingdom of God. Pray for those who may be called a step further.

Most especially, pray for the healing and support of all victims and survivors of clergy abuse.


