

Greetings Friends in Christ,

I have always looked forward to the second week in Advent, and the preaching of John the Baptist. Whether is read by someone else, or I read it in silence to myself, I hear Deacon John Cremin proclaiming it in my head. Until today I couldn't figure out why this reading is so memorable for me. Obstacles to Stewardship

It is essential, therefore, that we make a special effort to understand the true meaning of stewardship and live accordingly.
