My dear Friends,

As I write this note to you all today, I am in the back of my mind thinking of how to pack for this years March for Life Pilgrimage. While this trip centers around the issue of abortion and the US Supreme Court's historic Roe vs Wade decision, for me personally it has for a while now been one facet of what I try to maintain in a consistent life ethic.

The core principle of Catholic Social Teaching is the Dignity of the Human Person, which the fetus holds from the very moment of conception. It is not a matter of who the fetus is, or who he or she will be some day, but rather rests in the simple fact that they are made in the image and likeness of God. No one can ever remove that dignity.

This is why we must, with the same breath that we say NO to abortion, we must also say NO to the death penalty, war, assisted suicide, and euthanasia. We are challenged to find ways feed the hungry, clothe the naked, and shelter the homeless. No matter how great the challenge, we have to see that all deserve basic health care and that the migrant searching for something better, deserves our best efforts, not our ridicule or fear. Because at the center of each of these complex issues is a human person, made in the image and likeness of God, and their dignity can never be taken from them.


