Marriage: Contact parish office no less than six months prior to wedding date.


Sacrament of Anointing of Sick: Please contact us before a surgery, during hospitalization or if experiencing a change in health.



Last Sunday's Mass, where 14 young people received Jesus in the Eucharist for the first time, was a beautiful liturgy. At the end of his homily Fr Fred had the children stand and he repeated to them the question Jesus asked Peter three times, "Do you love me?" It was a powerful experience to witness. Despite many years of preparing children for the 1st Eucharist, I have never been a minister of the Eucharist for them. Afterward it was a privilege to be able to offer the chalice of Christ's Precious Blood to each child for the first time.

In reflection I had another "1st Holy Eucharist" moment this week. Earlier this week Erin's Mom, Bonnie, visited us for a few days. She was my sponsor when I was baptized and entered the church 14 years ago. She attended the Word and Communion service Wednesday night at St. Patrick. As I lifted Jesus in the Eucharist from the ciborium for her, I realized it was the first time that I would give her Holy Communion. The Body of Christ, from a part of the body, to a part of the body. My heart soared.
