Dear Friends in Christ,

In the first reading on the 16th Sunday in Ordinary we heard about Abraham welcoming three strangers, providing food and drink and shelter for them. I went on in my homily about our call to welcome strangers, including strangers to our borders. Several people came to me after that homily asking or encouraging me about doing more.

At our last pastoral council meeting, we discussed what might be done on a parish level. After some discussion we agreed that we need to begin with education and direction for personal involvement. The Texas Catholic Conference of Bishops suggests 6 ways to help. I have added or modified some suggestions after each.

• Call your legislators.

Cardinal Daniel DiNardo, Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston: "We urge courts and policy makers to respect and enhance, not erode, the potential of our asylum system to preserve and protect the right to life."

• Inform yourself.

Vatican's Migrant and Refugee Office

USCCB Office of Migration and Refugee Service

• Help organizations who are helping migrants now. Annunciation House

Kino Border Initiative

Columban Mission Center

Catholic Legal Immigration Network (CLINIC).

• Open your home to a refugee youth.

The USCCB offers a list of foster parent programs affiliated with them.

• Advocate for migrants with friends, family and publicly.

Pray for them!

Being informed is a huge first step and I encourage you to make yourself well informed on the refugee crisis. Ed & Marilyn Lorenz from our parish have made numerous trips to the border over the years and are always willing to talk about their experiences. Where we go from here I do not yet know. To paraphrase Edmund Burke - The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for people of good will to do nothing.
