## TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As October rolls around the days grow noticeably shorter and the mornings begin with a certain briskness in the air. The growing season comes to an end and turns to a time of harvest, and winter is before us, a time of dormancy and rest. In the church, the US Bishops set apart October as Respect Life month, with the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday recognized as Respect Life Sunday. This month ushers in a new theme, that is to be carried throughout the year, around our respect for human life. This year's theme could not be more fitting for cultivating a culture of life, "Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life."

If you look at the many headstones of our departed loved ones in the 3 parish cemeteries, there is a date, followed by a dash, followed by another date. Every child conceived should not be denied the first date, every elderly person must be treated with dignity and respect to the last date. And of upmost importance, we need to support policies and programs that respect the life of every person throughout that dash on the headstone. I encourage you to pray for a culture of life, living our life as Catholic Christians begins with prayer. Then take action: sign a petition, call or write an elected official, volunteer at a shelter, a soup kitchen, as a Big Brother/Big Sister, at a center for migrants or a pregnant mother support center. Christ is our hope, and He is with us throughout every season of life. We must be there for our brothers and sisters, in every season of life.
