

Dismemberment Abortion Ban Petition Complete

- Final petitions are being processed and will be delivered to the Secretary of State office on Monday, Dec. 23.
- Additional signatures were collected at the Trump Rally in Battle Creek on Dec. 18 and will be included.
- Barbara Listing, president of RTL is confident of a high validity rate of signatures.
- It is estimated that the final number of signatures collected will be between 375,000 and 400,000.

Thanks to all who were involved in this process! RTL and MCC will keep us updated on the petition which should be delivered to the legislature in Feb. or Mar for action.
