Dear Friends in Christ,

A number of people have come forward to me recently and mentioned how other people have been praying for them. Whether is was first mentioned in the bulletin, a small group, or even on Facebook, the need for prayers was heard and answered. They were approached by both close friends and strangers, in church and at the grocery store. The sense of peace and comfort they felt in this community of believers is one of the truest images we have of what it means to be the Church.

When I was at Nativity of the Lord parish, there was a prayer quilt ministry there. Many ladies of the church made quilts, and long threads were woven into the quilt and left dangling. Then parishioners said a prayer for the person and tied a knot. Most often the quilt was made for someone battling a serious illness, but sometimes the quilt was for a special life event. I received one as a gift from the parish for my ordination. I don't pull it out often, because it is so precious, and I also want to keep it away from the dog. But on a cold winters night, when worn out from a long day of ministry, the thought of being wrapped in all those loving prayers brings a true sense of peace.

All this brings to mind something we are going to start this Lent. In the gathering space will be a bare short tree, no leaves to be found. Next to it will be a basket of purple and pink ribbons and a marker. You can write a persons name or a short prayer, and then pray for that person and tie the ribbon to the tree. When Easter comes we will switch to white and gold ribbon, then red at Pentecost and shades of green for Ordinary time. A reminder of our prayers the whole year through. And over the year, the tree will fill with ribbons of every color, adorned in the beauty of our prayers.
