

In March, you'll receive information in the mail from the federal government about the 2020 census and how to respond. This count occurs every ten years and will determine our state's representation in Congress for the next decade, as well as the way legislative lines are drawn at local levels. It will also play a significant role in how federal funding is distributed, impacting schools, hospitals, road construction, and more. When people are not counted, communities lose out. It is hard to believe that Ash Wednesday is only one week away. It really seems like Christmas was only a couple of weeks ago, and we just celebrated Epiphany. I took a moment to look ahead to when Ash Wednesday falls next year, and it is even earlier, February 17th. In the next 9 years, till 2029, Ash Wednesday falls only 3 times in March and never as late as last years March 6th. It will fall on the feast of St. Valentine, TWICE, and its earliest arrival will be February 10th in 2027. We can enjoy the fact that it is so "late" this year.

We can sometimes get caught up in the penitential aspect of Lent and its rigors of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving and come to think of it as a time to be sad. But Lent is time to prepare for the overwhelming Joy of Easter. Just like when our Moms used to tell us not to eat a bunch of snacks just before a special meal because we'd ruin our appetite, Lent is a time to prepare our hearts for the bountiful feast of Easter.

For your Lenten fast this year I would like to make the suggestion that you in someway tie it to both prayer and almsgiving. If you give up the morning Latte, take the money you usually would spend every day and put it in your Rice Bowl, and donate it to the Food Pantry, Heifer International or another charitable cause that supports the poor. Then take that time that you get back, not driving to the coffee shop, standing in line and the time you spend drinking the coffee, and turn that time to prayer especially for those in need. Even if you give up something that doesn't normally cost money, you can make a monetary sacrifice to go with your prayer. Recall Bishop Gruss challenged us to spend 30 minutes a day in prayer, this may be the boost you need to get there.
