

Dear Friends in Christ,

My big "Fast" this Lent is from letting my phone dominate my life. I moved all my games, entertainment, news, and social media apps to the last screen where they will stay, tucked away in too many folders, for the season of Lent. The upshot with this is more time for prayer and reading. Last night, after getting home from St. Patrick, I settled in with the latest issue of America magazine. The TV purposefully off, I welcomed the quiet break from noise.

I was soon into the feature article -<u>For God So Loved the World</u> which dealt with dealing with a sense of dread in reference to global climate change. I was a little surprised that author claimed to have never heard anything regarding the environment in a homily. Perhaps it is a combination of farming life, the outdoor life of hunting/fishing and being surrounded by almost 22% of the worlds surface freshwater that makes it so easy for us here in mid-Michigan to think and talk about the environment and caring for God's creation.

The article swam with quotes from Pope Benedict XVI, Pope John Paul II, along side Pope Francis. It mentioned Dorothy Day and the Catholic Worker movement, C.S. Lewis and his essay -<u>Living in the Atomic</u> <u>Age</u>. But it was an "oft-quoted prayer" that caught my eye even from a column away. I saw the first four words "We cannot do everything" and knew immediately it was Bishop Ken Untener's "Prophets of a Future Not Our Own". Here is the quoted part.

We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest. We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders; ministers, not messiahs.

The takeaway? That in the face of the seemingly impossible, individual actions no matter how small, do matter. No I will not stop global climate change on my own, but my reducing, reusing and recycling matters. No I will not solve the problems of abortion, immigration, economic imbalance, racism or any number of other global crisis on my own. But my prayer, my kindness towards others, my support of the neglected and my action does matter.
