

I had a disturbing little discovery with my phone the other day. As I mentioned before, I have given up doing a lot of things on my phone, related to social media and games especially, for Lent. I still use my phone for various things including phone calls, emails and texts, prayer and other little useful tools. In reorganizing my screens I stumbled across a builtin app for measuring screen time. I should mention I have an iPhone, if you are on an Android you might not have this built into your phone, but there are other apps that you can get to do this.

This little tool tracks how much time you spend in each app, breaks it down by category; Productivity, Social Networking, Health & Fitness, Game etc. There it is, not in black and white, but rather in full color with pretty little icons and graphs, how much time your face has been turned toward that 2.5"x5.5" screen. Eyes that weren't toward a loved one, a neighbor, or the stranger in your midst. Eyes that might not be seeing the crisis that is near you, or the beauty that surrounds you.

Even with the reduction since the start of Lent, the numbers I saw were shocking to say the least. And when you combine a day's total into a weekly total, and a weekly total into a month, the phrase about time flying takes on a new meaning. Like almost any tool, there is a right way and a wrong way to use it, and what we do with the tool can be good or bad. I plan to continue to watch my usage after Lent ends.
