From our Diocese

Rev. Robert D. Gruss, Bishop of Saginaw, announced four men have been accepted as seminarians for the Diocese of Saginaw, doubling the number of seminarians in our diocese. These men will spend the next six to nine years discerning a priestly vocation while studying at several seminaries across the country. They are:

- Daniel Christe, 41, Our Lady of Czestochowa Parish, Bay City. He will study at Sacred Heart Seminary in Wis. this fall.
- Joshua High, 27, St. Brigid of Kildare Parish, Midland. He will study at Sacred Heart Seminary in Mich. this fall.
- Jan Szwajnos, 31, from Zakopane, Poland. He has been studying at Ss. Cyril & Methodius Seminary in Mich., and will spend a pastoral year in the Diocese of Saginaw.
- Charles Warner, 29, St. John Vianney Parish, Saginaw. He will study at Sacred Heart Seminary in Mich. this fall.

As we anticipate the planning of events, Covid-19 continues to impact our ability to proceed as usual. Today, I am announcing that the pilgrimage to the Annual March for Life in Washington, D.C. in Jan. has been canceled for the safety of our youth and adults.

However, I am pleased to announce that the Chancery Offices of Youth Ministry and Respect Life have created an alternative plan so our mission of proclaiming respect for life continues despite the circumstances. Our focus remains on reaching youth, but we believe these events will impact people of all ages. The following events are planned for January.

9 Days for Life will begin on January 21 with a Novena for Life and continue daily with prayers, novenas, rosaries and more. Each day podcasts will be shared. All are invited to participate online, in small groups and via live streaming. The 9 Days for Life will conclude with a Mass at the Cathedral on January 29.

The Local March for Life will be on Friday, Jan. 22 with the option for parishes to host a "March in Place" at their location simultaneously. Together we will raise our voices and prayers in the protection of the sanctity of human life. At the conclusion, Mass for the Legal Protection of the Unborn will be celebrated (live streamed) at the Cathedral of Mary of the Assumption.
