Five Women Profess Vows

On Sunday, Aug. 16, five women professed their perpetual vows as Religious Sisters of Mercy of Alma, Michigan during Mass at the Cathedral of Mary of the Assumption in Saginaw. The sisters professing vows were Sister Mary Rafqa Boulos, Sister Mary Elisha Glady, Sister Marie Josepha Kluczny, Sister Maliya Suen, and Sister Marie Faustina Wolniakowski.

During the Mass, each sister professed her vows— including poverty, chastity, obedience and the service of the poor, sick and ignorant while kneeling before Mother Mary McGreevy, superior general of the Religious Sisters of Mercy of Alma. After each sister had professed vows, Bishop Robert Gruss prayed a solemn prayer of consecration over the sisters. Mother Mary McGreevy then placed a ring signifying their religious profession on the finger of each sister, reminding them that they are betrothed to the eternal King, Jesus. Dear Friends in Christ,

Thank you for your kind words regarding last weeks homily. In spending time reflecting on racism and racial injustice, I am sometimes left overwhelmed by the scope of the problem. The questions "What can I do?" and "Where do I begin?" are oft buried under the enormity of the problem, leaving one without anyway forward. At times such as these I am then reminded of the opening words of Bishop Ken Untener's "Prophet's of a Future Not Our Own"

> It helps, now and then, to step back and take a long view. The kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is even be yond our vision.

We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work.

The roots of racism, across the world and in particular here in the United States, began long before our lives and the solution almost certainly lies beyond their ending. But as with our work in the cooperation of the Kingdom of God, we are not off the hook regarding our participation in ending racism. Turning again to the wisdom of Bishop Ken we see that in our small steps God's work is brought to fulfillment.

- We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise.
- We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces far beyond our capabilities.
- We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that.
- This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest.

None of us will solve the problem of racism on our own. But each of us, acting with the mercy and love of Jesus, and help the seed of racial equality grow.

This week inserted in the bulletin is the brief article on Examining Our Subconscious Perceptions, from the USCCB's Ad Hoc Committee Against Racism. In the coming weeks you will find other resources to help water the seed of justice.
