Night Prayer

The 9:00pm Livestream of Night Payer has been a wonderful and important gathering since it began back on Wednesday of the 3rd week of Lent. It began without music, with a single camera pointed at the altar and tabernacle, speaking into an iPhone mic with all the background noise, going live only to Facebook, and manually uploading to YouTube. It as become a little more involved now, but its richness both now and at the beginning comes from the community that continues to gather together.

With a more regular public worship schedule, Night Prayer is no longer the only public worship, but it still holds value. Going forward, Night Prayer will shift to 2-3 nights a week, on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. I look forward to continuing to gather in prayer with you. O God come to my assistance, Lord make haste to help me.

Daily Mass

Long before COVID began, Fr. Fred and I were discussing the possibility of a regular weekday Mass schedule. Word & Communion celebrations are great, but Communion within the celebration of Mass is so much more appropriate when possible. Fr. Fred enjoys celebrating Mass with the community and Wednesday weekday mass will continue. When possible we will livestream the 10:00am Mass so those at home may join with us.
