Dear friends in Christ,

A few weeks ago, I held a class on how to prayer the Liturgy of the Hours, the official daily prayer of the church. Based on the psalms and other scriptural readings, it follows a four-week cycle mixed within the liturgical seasons of the church and the memorials of the many saints.

Because of cyclical nature of this prayer, the prayer book has many ribbons to keep one's place while praying as different parts of the book are utilized. While you can pray this on a computer, tablet or smartphone with out flipping pages, I always find I am better focused when I use my physical book.

I think this comes not simply for needing to pay closer attention, but from the tactile nature of praying this way. We turn pages, and tug at ribbons, not unlike how our fingers rub the smooth surface of the beads on our rosary. When prayed in community, only the leader needs a physical rosary to keep place. I still find that I pray better with a rosary in my hand. I believe this is not because of rosary itself, but points to our unique human nature, of body and spirit together.

When we pray, we commune with the divine spirit of God. In prayer with a tactile component, we may find that we connect with God with less physical distraction. Not that our bodies or the world around is wrong, or bad, or something that we need to be rid of. For we remember that at our birth, the entirety of creation was seen by God as not just good, but very good, "God created mankind in his image; in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them...God looked at everything he had made, and found it very good. Evening came, and morning followed—the sixth day." Genesis 1:27, 31

If tactile prayer helps us focus on our time with God, be it in the Liturgy of the Hours or the Rosary, it is good. Perhaps we find it easier in emptying ourselves, making room for Jesus in our hearts through Christian Meditation. Journaling or making sacred art, contemplative prayer and Lectio Divina or any of the other rich prayer traditions of the church sit open before us.

Today we lifted our hearts to God, who is already with us in our hearts, at Mass as we started the week. How will we speak with God not just tomorrow, but every day until we gather next Sunday?
