Hospitalized/Homebound Ministry: Please call the office to arrange for Eucharist or for a pastoral visit.



For the next few weeks, I hope that you find this column helps you waste time. Steve Angrisano tells a story of a monk from Saint Meinrad speaking to youth at a conference about prayer. The monk tells all these high school students that prayer is a big waste of time. As a monk he prays 7 times a day and it seems a big waste of time because we expect these big things to happen.

But just like the teens who "waste time" with their friends something happens below the surface. When two kids hang out, playing games, listening to music, or any other youthful activity, a relationship forms. And the more they do it the closer they become, they become aware of each other's needs, desires, fears, hopes and dreams. The activity wasn't necessarily constructive, but the relationship that forms is.

Prayer draws us into deeper relationship with God. God know us intimately, and through prayer, we can grow to know him similarly. We also learn, through prayer to know how deeply God knows and loves us.

For the next few weeks I will be focusing this column on prayer. I will be writing on ways to pray, its history and tradition, and how we can approach it more deeply. From structured prayer, to more experiential forms, I will seek to cover a wide variety. If there is a particular manner of prayer you would like to learn more about, drop me a message and I will try to include it.
