# Wasting Time with God: Christian Meditation

The last couple of weeks we have been talking about a very verbal form of prayer, the Liturgy of the Hours. Spoken or preferably sung in choir, this form of communal prayer combines the Psalms and other readings into beautiful ebb and flow of prayer life throughout the hours of the day and the church seasons.

Christian Meditation, particularly in the tradition of Fr. John Main, OSB, is the complete opposite, at least in terms of its verbosity. St. John Damascene said prayer was "the raising of one's mind and heart to God…" If looked at in this way, Christian Meditation can be the getting the mind out of the way, so that our hearts lie open before God.

And how is this manner of prayer practiced? It follows three S's: Silence, Stillness and Simplicity.

*Silence:* While there might be a spoken prayer at the beginning and/or end, the bulk of the prayer is non spoken. Even more so, it is not spent in thought in our minds, workings things out or "talking" with God. Silence outside and silence inside.

*Stillness:* This is a prayer of physical stillness. Stillness of the body leads to stillness of the mind. Sitting in a chair, with one's back straight and feet firmly on the floor. Our hands should be gently folded in out laps, or laying on our thighs. This stillness helps us be aware that our bodies are sacred temples of the Holy Spirit.

*Simplicity:* No wordy or theologically complex prayers to memorize. The simplicity is found in the steady and continuous repetition of a prayer word or mantra. A great choice is the word "maranatha" which is Aramaic and translates as "Come Lord". Repeated silently in our minds eye as 4 syllables, MA-RA-NA-THA.

This silence and stillness is done twice a day for generally a minimum of 20 minutes each. There is a story of a person replying to a monk "I don't have time for 30 minutes of prayer, I have too many things to do." The monk replies "You are right, make it an hour." The thought is, the less free we think we are to spend time in prayer, the more likely we have greater need for it, and more of it.

Christian Meditation is incredibly simple and challenging at the same time. It allows us to lay our hearts bare before God and encounter him in the silence of our hearts.
