What a wonderful experience we shared last weekend. I do not think we could have asked for better weather, and so much great food and fellowship to share afterward. I am still bubbling over with joy. Thanks again to all the great folks who made the day so special.

I want to tell you about a few things in brief, that we will cover in more detail later. First up *A Disciple's Walk With God*. We are now registering people for this catechetical program, which kicks off Tuesday Oct 19th and runs for 8 weeks. It will have small groups for adults and youth, and programing for our younger children. Please register so we can plan accordingly as we grow together as disciples.

The Grotto restoration was a great achievement, and it brings us to some other projects, large and small that we will need to tackle. The Electronic sign is one, which has grant funding and some sizable donations behind it and will hopefully move forward soon. We are also looking at resurfacing the top rails of the pews at St Vincent de Paul, which have occasionally given folks slivers.

A few weeks ago, the cross atop St Patrick Church lost an arm and we are presently researching whether insurance will cover the repair. We also need to repair or replace the cross on top of St. Vincent de Paul Church. And an even larger project still is the spauling brick on the bell tower, which may require major renovations.

Lastly I would like to turn back to the Grotto, and specifically the statuary. The statues in the Grotto are made of wood and were never intended for outdoor display. All three need extensive renovation, and even if restored they shouldn't be returned to outdoor display. We will need to study the needs of the parish and determine what is in the best interest of the parish in terms of the original statues, what is best for display in the grotto, and where we go from here. Following this weekend's services, the statues will be moved into storage.

All of this may seem overwhelming, but in my brief three years here at St Vincent de Paul one thing I've come to know is this. Nothing is beyond the capability of this parish, to ensure that our parish, our faith and our love is felt in this community for ages to come.
