# Diocese to celebrate '9 Days for Life'

January 21 to 29, the Diocese of Saginaw will celebrate "9 Days for Life" and gather at eight parishes to pray for and raise awareness of respect for human life.

The 9 Days for Life will open with the Knights of Columbus Novena for Life on Jan. 21 at the Cathedral of Mary of the Assumption in Saginaw. The Novena will then continue at seven additional parishes each day until the final day on Jan. 29 at the Cathedral. The K of C Council from each parish will lead the Novena, which may be followed by an event, such as Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, Rosary and more. Each parish will also livestream their events.

In addition, formation and lesson plan packets will be shared.
