Synod Corner

As we journey closer to our time of sharing with and listening to each other for a synodal Church in the Synodal process, we continue to turn to the

Holy Spirit in prayer for guidance. Kristyn J. Russell of Blessed Sacrament in Midland did an excellent job breaking open this prayer, and you can find the entire text at the link at the end of the message. We want to share the following portion with you, hoping you will review the whole message.

> Teach us the way we must go and how we are to pursue it. We are weak and sinful; do not let us promote disorder. Do not let ignorance lead us down the wrong path

nor partiality influence our actions.

This stanza might be the hardest one to digest. We don't typically like to call attention to our deficits and sin. But it's true that we are weak and we are sinful. We're acknowledging that we have biases and agendas. We're asking the Holy Spirit to help form our hearts, our minds, and our actions. We're asking the Spirit to help us recognize our biases and agendas and, as we participate in the Synodal Process, to be able to discern between what we want and what the Spirit wants. The original Latin says, "do not let us disturb the order of justice." We must remain focused on what is right and just, and not stand in the way of the Holy Spirit.
