

Dear Friends in Christ,

Let me begin with a word of thanks to you from Erin and myself. We very much appreciated your prayers and offers of assistance as we dealt with COVID. We are well along the way to full recovery.

Last night both the Pastoral and Finance councils met in their bi-annual joint session. We discussed the results of the Synod listening sessions, and I want to share with you some of that and how the parish is beginning to respond. The executive summary is as follows:

- * In three total sessions, approximately 65 people participated, including facilitators.
- * Parish is welcoming and does liturgy well. (N.B. The parish has had the same sacramental minister for the last 13+ years, through 4 different parish administrators)
- * Parishioners are concerned with how to reach the fallen away and the young.



* Parishioners would like to see more opportunities for small groups and more staff for young people.

As a start to our response, I am directing the parish, along with the councils' support, to respond in the following way:

- We will reach out to 15 fallen-away families with children who were baptized since 2000 to join us for a special mass on June 12, 2022 – The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. This outreach will be done through mailings, personal invitations, and prayer.
- 2. We will create a job description and part-time position for a Youth Minister for our parish. This new position will require significant support from the parish, both in prayer and stewardship.
- 3. This fall, we will work on a new Parish pictorial directory that allows us to reach out to all parishioners and update our records.

Finally, a special subcommittee of the Finance Council made presentations on Building and Grounds repairs that need to be undertaken. This committee will now prioritize this list of what can be accomplished by staff and parish teams and what requires outside contractors. One item of concern is energy efficiency and aging infrastructure. We will be replacing all fluorescent lights, of which there are over 650 in all our buildings, with L.E.D. fixtures. Volunteers will handle this project, so the only cost is for the new bulbs. We will also replace the 1,000,000 BTU low-efficiency boiler and water heaters in the school and social hall. This will be paid out of parish savings, offset by donations to the Building and Grounds Fund.

The hope is that we spend this money to help make the parish more efficient in doing the critical work of evangelizing, so we spend our resources doing the work of Christ.
