Y.E.S. (Youth Encounter Service) June 19-24

This week-long service camp and immersion experience gives high school students an opportunity to learn about and fight poverty, while reaching out to the poor. Each June, youth spend five days of their summer vacation sprucing up yards and making minor repairs to several homes selected in the city of Saginaw. In addition to moving lawns, trimming bushes and painting, Youth Encounter Service participants learn more about Catholic Social teaching. They also spend part of the week volunteering at various outreach organizations in the community. Evening activities include guest speakers, prayer, and reflection on the experiences of the day. The fee for the week is \$150.00; this includes overnight accommodations, all meals, transportation all week long, evening programs, work materials and socials. Ever wonder where our hosts come from?

As you know, the contents of our altar breads are strictly prescribed by the Catholic Church. An ordinary bakery does not suffice.

The hosts we use here at our parish are produced by the Monastery of the Blessed Sacrament according to Catholic guidelines. (We also stock some low-gluten hosts which were developed and supplied to us by a monastery in Missouri.)

The Monastery of the Blessed Sacrament is the home of Cloistered Dominican Nuns, and it was established as an act of thanksgiving to God on the seven hundredth anniversary of the foundation of the first monastery of nuns by the Blessed Father St. Dominic. Their mission is to praise, to bless, and to preach.

Usually our contact with the nuns at the Monastery is limited to a phone call to place an order, but sometimes the person on their end of the line is chatty and you realize that their group is "just people" like we are 'just people." Placing the order can be a great start to a day!

With our most recent shipment of altar breads, we found a couple of extra things in the box. One of the items was a flyer with information on their *first ever* overnight discernment retreat. There was also a letter of invitation/information and a brochure. This group is truly excited to be *host-esses* (our word, not theirs) of this retreat.
