Annual Christ's Mission Appeal

This is an opportunity to give God thanks. Your generosity allows for the continuation of many ministries while engaging in evangelization.

As of Nov. 23, this diocesan appeal is at 52% of its goal. Only one parish has surpassed its goal so far, but six more are over 75%. Our parish was at 58% on November 23.. Dear Friends in Christ,

In a little more than a week from now, we will gather together for a communal penance service. This service on December 13th at 6:00 pm is the liturgical counterpart to the Confiteor we pray at mass on the Sundays of Advent.

I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done, and in what I have failed to do; through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God

In the first part, we admit to God and each other that we are broken and need God's mercy. We share our mutual brokenness by praying out loud and together. No one is so perfect that they don't need God's infinite mercy.

In the end, we share our need for each other's prayers. We ask Mary and all the Angels and Saints to intercede for us. But there is a humble aspect of admitting that we need each other's support in seeking God's mercy.

This need for support is why the Communal Penance service is so essential. Whether we need to confess our sins individually, the need to support each other means we should all take part in this beautiful service. This is a wonderful evening of communal prayer, gentle music, and private prayer before Christ's presence in the tabernacle.

Let us gather together on December 13th and support each other in coming before God's mercy in the Sacrament of Reconciliation.
