Marriage: Contact parish office no less than six months prior to wedding date.



Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend we begin the brief Season of Ordinary Time that falls between Christmas and Lent. Sourcebooks on liturgical environments suggest that deeper greens be used when decorating the church, if available. These colors evoke the image of conifers and hollies that stay green throughout the year.

Those evergreen plants grow in the winter. We tend to think of winter as dormant, a period of time when nothing grows. But evergreens grow in the winter. They use the available water and sunshine and grow, even if slower than in Summer.

And we can make this same mistake with the quiet season of Ordinary Time between Christmas and Lent. Nothing much is happening, it might seem on the surface. But these next seven weeks, we will hear of Jesus beginning his ministry. First with his encounters with John the Baptist and then the beginning of the Sermon on the Mount. These teachings are foundational to our faith, and this quiet wintertime offers us the peace to contemplate their beauty and simplicity.

I suggest taking time each weekend this winter before or after Mass (or even both) to reflect on the Sunday Gospel. Let the evergreen of the Gospel feed your soul.
