
Marriage: Contact parish office no less than six months prior to wedding date.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Last Sunday, Erin and I traveled to Chicago to partake in a lecture series on the Wonder of Creation at the Catholic Theological Union. The speaker was Br. Guy Consolmagno, SJ, director of the Vatican Observatory. It was an excellent lecture, if a little short, that pointed out the difference between nature and creation and that creation is not a point of time in the past but ongoing. Br. Guy was commenting on the immensity of the universe; our planet revolves around 1 star in 1 galaxy with ~100 billion stars, and there are over 100 billion galaxies in the universe. That means there is something like

10,000,000,000,000,000,000 stars in the universe. We might mistakenly think in comparison that we are small and insignificant. Another, and proper way of thinking about that, is how big God must be that knows even our innermost thought.

While listening to the lecture, I was reminded of the recent work of the evangelization team, which began by pondering the question: Why is there something rather than nothing? The simple answer is, of course, God. But even beyond that, we acknowledge that God, who needs nothing from the universe itself, creates it through an ongoing act of love. We hear this in the first creation story, the first chapter of Genesis, which reaches its zenith in verse 31, "God looked at everything he had made, and found it very good. Evening came, and morning followed—the sixth day." You and I, everyone we have ever met, everyone who ever was, and whoever will be, regardless of their circumstances, were created in love as a very good part of a very good universe.
