PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

Dear Friends in Christ,

When it comes to using incense at Mass, it seems we either love it or can't stand it. Using incense during the liturgy is one way to practice progressive solemnity on more solemn occasions, such as the Paschal Triduum and Octave of Easter. Our most regular use of incense is during the song of farewell at funeral liturgies. The benefit here is a two-fold reminder: first, that the deceased, by the grace of their baptism, was a temple of the Holy Spirit, and second, that our prayers for them rise to God.

While we use mild and hypoallergenic incense here at St. Vincent de Paul, it can still bother some people. To minimize distress, we try to restrict the use of incense to near the altar. This is one reason we try to avoid incense during the entrance procession. Still, there are times that procession with incense is a distinct part of the liturgy.

- 1. Incense is used whenever the Blessed Sacrament is processed, such as to the tabernacle of reservation on Holy Thursday or in Eucharistic Processions.
- 2. Incense is used when the Book of the Gospels is processed on solemn occasions, especially during the Easter Vigil.

Using incense for the Gospel procession and proclamation reverences "the words of eternal life." We then use incense again at the offertory, offering a sweet fragrance to God, which we offer up to be transformed by the Holy Spirit; the bread, the wine, and our very selves. Using incense at both parts of the liturgy helps link the two and reminds us that we are people of Word and Sacrament.

I look forward to seeing you at the Easter liturgies as we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ.
