*Marriage:* Contact parish office no less than six months prior to wedding date.


Sacrament of Anointing of Sick: Please contact us before a surgery, during hospitalization or if experiencing a change in health.

Dear Friends in Christ,

*Sacramentum caritatis,* The Sacrament of Charity, is Pope Benedict the XVI's apostolic exhortation that followed the Bishop's Synod on the Eucharist. It consists of 3 major parts looking at the Eucharist as a mystery.

- 1. The Eucharist is a mystery to be believed.
- 2. The Eucharist is a mystery to be celebrated.
- 3. The Eucharist is a mystery to be lived.

All three parts of this papal document deserve attention during this Eucharistic Revival, but for the moment we are going to look toward the end. As I shared last week, this mystery is to be lived. Pope Benedict goes on in paragraph 79.

"The eucharistic sacrifice nourishes and increases within us all that we have already received at Baptism, with its call to holiness, and *this must be clearly evident from the way individual Christians live their lives* [emphasis added]. Day by day we become "a worship pleasing to God" by living our lives as a vocation.

To the outsider, we must look different than others in how we live our lives. This is not simply that we are all at the same place at 4:30 PM on Saturday or 10:00 AM on Sunday. No, in the other 167 hours a week, the words we chose, the decisions we make, and the actions we take must be in the image and likeness of Christ, whose image and likeness we too must bear when we become what we receive.

Pope Benedict points further to this, that the world is our mission field.

"And because the world is "the field" in which God plants his children as good seed, the Christian laity, by virtue of their Baptism and Confirmation, and strengthened by the Eucharist, are called to live out the radical newness brought by Christ wherever they find themselves. They should cultivate a desire that the Eucharist have an ever deeper effect on their daily lives, making them convincing witnesses in the workplace and in society at large."

This, my friends, is one I my personal goals of this revival; that we allow the Eucharist to have a deeper effect on our lives. I do not yet know how we arrive there, but I am certain the Holy Spirit will be a guide to us.
