Dear Friends in Christ,

What are your thoughts about the Eucharistic Revival? We entered the parish year of the Revival on June 11, 2023. That is two months and two days ago as of this Sunday.

- · Have you spent more time thinking about what it means to a Eucharistic people?
- · Have you considered what we mean when we talk about Real Presence?
- Do you get distracted or daydream during the Eucharistic Prayer?
- Do you audibly say Amen when you receive Communion?
- Do you hunger for Eucharist like we did in the early days of COVID?
- · Do you ever come to spend quiet time in the church with the Blessed Sacrament?
- · Have you invited someone who has fallen away back to Mass in the last two months?
- Do you feel closer to God than you did a year ago?
- Does receiving Christ's Body and Blood send you out as a missionary disciple, or urge you to return to Mass? Or is it both?
- · Do you have a relationship with God?

I ask these questions because we are underway for this Eucharistic Revival and wonder where we go next. The revival was called for two reasons: a Pew Research survey that said people don't understand the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, and they aren't returning to Mass following the pandemic.

Of those two issues, many experts consider the first is overstated, and people not returning to Mass was a problem long before COVID. For a survey we did for the diocese, SVDP scored well in understanding Real Presence. So I am genuinely curious about your thoughts on those questions above. We must journey together on this Eucharistic Revival to be all enriched. To do that, we need to know what tools we have, what tools we need, where we are, and what path we follow. Please drop me a note, email, or pop into the office to share your thoughts on these questions.
