Marriage: Contact parish office no less than six months prior to wedding date.


Sacrament of Anointing of Sick: Please contact us before a surgery, during hospitalization or if experiencing a change in health.

Dear Friends in Christ,

The shouting voices of young people rising over the noise of air conditioning on this humid day let me know that Shepherd Public Schools are back in session. We join our prayers with theirs for a school year full of joyful learning, rising to meet challenges, and growing in maturity.

Even though many people reading this article are long beyond the point of having children in school, our lives are impacted by the school calendar. We plan for traffic around the school twice a day. We need to be aware of school buses on the roads. There are more activities available in the evenings for us to watch in the form of sports, music, drama, robotics, and more.

All of this is in addition to the normal rhythm of our daily lives. Work, commuting, volunteering, cooking, shopping, laundry, house and yard work, some form of recreation, and, of course, sleep. These things impact our time, even more so for parents with those responsibilities and their children's.

It should be glaringly obvious that I have omitted something, the most important something, God. We spend the 168 hours of every week trying to cram one more thing in, desperate for rest. Frantically, we try to cram in something else on the too-short weekend before we must turn in to bed to prepare for whatever Monday brings to our lives.

We tend to think of Sunday as the last day of the week, but as disciples of Christ, we are reminded that Sunday begins the week.

After the sabbath, as the **first day of the week was dawning**, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to see the tomb. Mt 28:1

But at **daybreak on the first day of the week** they took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb. Luke 24:1

On the **evening of that first day of the week**, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." John 20:19

Setting aside time for God, our celebration of the Lord's Day is not something crammed in at the end of the week. We celebrate the Lord's resurrection on the first day as we begin our week. Mentally placing the Sunday celebration at the start of the week helps us remember that everything begins with God.

When we begin with God, we find more time for him in our lives, not just on Sundays but every day of the week. When we become ordered toward God, the rest of our lives become ordered as well.
