Marriage: Contact parish office no less than six months prior to wedding date.



I was recently reading a liturgical guideline book titled <u>Litur-</u> <u>gy With Style and Grace</u>, a wonderful text for examining how the liturgy works in a parish. There is always a delicate balance between doing things the way we always have, and making changes not for the sake of change, but because it leads to something deeper or better. In the side bar of the section on Lent it had this reflection on the season.

"Lent is not tidy. Days grow longer (the word "Lent" comes from "lengthen"), the ground thaws, and the next thing we know, everything is filthy. Our windows need washing, our temples need cleansing, the earth itself needs a good bath. The English names of these months come from the ancient words that reflect the need to roll up our sleeves this season: February ("purification") and March ("the spirit of war"). Good names. Winter doesn't leave without blustery battles that push things over and mess things up and even break things. Lent, if we honestly face its fury, will leave the landscape littered with bits and pieces of ourselves."

So we live in this time, reflecting on the mess around us and in our lives. We stare and the disorder and grime, the chaos and the aches of our lives. We gather up the pieces as best we can, and wonder "What now?"

We can in this time, remember the one gave us a pure heart to begin with. We can turn to the Divine Physician who can heal our aches and clean our wounds. We can come to the Master Builder, and ask him to put the broken pieces together again, and bring order to our lives. It is this or foolishly live in a way we don't need to live, and aren't made to live. We can be whole.
