Dear Friends in Christ,

This Saturday we will celebrate the First Scrutiny for our elect, Greg Krafft. The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults describes the scrutinies as "rites for self-searching and repentance and have above all a spiritual purpose. The scrutinies are meant to uncover, then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect: to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong and good."

All three scrutinies are rooted in the Gospel readings of the day. , and follow the same pattern. First silent prayer over the elect, followed by a series of intercessions on their behalf by the community, an exorcism, and finally a dismissal to go reflect upon the Word of God.

Below are some the intercessions for the First Scrutiny. They are good for us to pray for Greg, but important to remember for ourselves as well.

- That, like the woman of Samaria, our elect may review their lives before Christ and acknowledge their sins...
- That they may be freed from the spirit of mistrust that deters people from following Christ...
- That while awaiting the gift of God, they made long with all their hearts for the living water that brings eternal life...
- That by accepting the Son of God as their teacher, they may become true worshippers of the Father in spirit and in truth...
- That they may share with their friends and neighbors the wonder of their own meeting with Christ...
- That those whose lives are empty for want of the word of God make come to the gospel of Christ...
- That all of us may learn from Christ to do the Father's will in love...
