Marriage: Contact parish office no less than six months prior to wedding date.


Sacrament of Anointing of Sick. Please contact us before a surgery, during hospitalization or if experiencing a change in health.

Dear friends in Christ,

What can you do with an hour with the Lord? That is a question I ask all of you to consider as we prepare for our Tri-Parish Eucharistic Congress communion. From mass each morning until benediction later that evening you will have the opportunity to prayerfully gather around the same Jesus as those gathered in Indianapolis for the National Congress.

In the fall of 2022 I wrote a brief paper for my Introduction to Liturgy and Sacraments course entitled 'The Introduction to Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Parish Setting.' There are a few copies available in the back of the church for those interested. One of my favorite parts covering why we should spend time in adoration is this:

"Like the lover and the beloved, time spent together increases the desire to be together. Beyond the simple desire for each other, the time spent together also increases our understanding of one another. Christ knows each of us intimately, but time spent with Christ helps us to understand him better."

At Nativity and Saint Paul parishes there is no need to sign up, just show up anytime and spend some quiet time in prayer with the Lord. One important aspect for exposition is that there must be two people at all times praying before the Eucharist. For this reason please consider signing up for an hour on the sign up sheet at the back of the church.

May this time of prayer be beneficial to our faith and to our world.
