Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend we enjoy the final extended weekend of the summer vacation season with the recognition of Labor Day on Monday, September 2nd. The USCCB, in its Labor Day statement for 2024 Begins with the call to "recommit ourselves to building together a society that honors the human dignity of all who labor. Through the treasure of Catholic social teaching, we have a long history of proclaiming the essential role labor plays and helping people to live out their human dignity."

Human dignity is the starting point of so much of our Catholic understanding of the world and our work toward a just society. Protection for the unborn is rooted in the recognition of the human person who is to be afforded the dignity of life. The elderly and the infirm are to be afforded protections because they continue to possess the same human dignity. Human dignity is complete in every person. No one lacks it and no one possesses a greater or lesser amount due to their state of life or what they do. As each worker possesses the fullness of human dignity they should never work in fear for their livelihood or life when seeking just wages or protection.

We must remember that all work that contributes to the good of all is honorable. "Work represents a fundamental dimension of human existence as participation not only in the act of creation but also in that of redemption."* Our place of employment now or where we worked before retirement is a part of our vocational call. As such, this Labor Day holds a special significance for all of us.


