Dear friends in Christ

It is hard to believe that next weekend is the Solemnity of Jesus Christ King of the Universe. This celebration and its newer title, not simply Christ the King, but King of the Universe, is a great end to a Liturgical year, as we prepare to begin anew with Advent the following week.

Amidst the drama of the recent election, we come to a feast that should remind us all that no matter what we see on election maps, or the clothes we wear, as disciples of Jesus Christ, we wear neither Red nor Blue. The King of the Universe calls for us to project only his dazzling white light that he shares with us. We do so through our words and through our actions, and to do anything less filters out God. Rather than the words of the Lord Prayer "...thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven" when we project only our bias, we say, "don't worry God, I know better."

6 years ago, in my first Advent & Christmas letter to the parish, I wrote "we celebrate not just the birth of a child, not just our Savior, but a love so great it is not simply a feeling but a person in Christ Jesus." Next weekend we will have this years letter available for pickup after the weekend Masses. I invite you in the love and person of Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, to pick up a letter for a friend, neighbor, or family member who doesn't join us for Mass regularly, and deliver the love from this parish family in person.
